

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# The University of Hong Kong Graduate Employment Situation 2000 Dental Graduates

# I. <u>Executive Summary</u>

- 1.1 This year, a total of 58 students graduated from the Faculty of Dentistry. Valid responses were provided by 52 graduates, giving a response rate of 90%.
- 1.2 48 graduates (92%) worked as dental surgeons. 4 graduates (7.7%) were still seeking employment at the time of the survey.
- 1.3 Only one graduate had set up his/her own clinic. 64% of the graduates also planned to do so in future.
- 1.4 The dental graduates of 2000 took shorter time to secure employment than the previous year's graduates.
- 1.5 Compared with 1999, a lower percentage of graduates worked more than 51 hours (excluding lunch hours) per week. (51% in 2000 compared with 56% in 1999.)
- 1.6 The average monthly income was \$22,752, up 4% from the previous year's \$21,970.
- 1.7 75% of the dental graduates of 2000 were satisfied with their jobs.

# II. <u>Methodology</u>

Questionnaires were sent out to all 58 graduates in November 2000, with one subsequent mail reminder in December, telephone interview was carried out in early January 2001 to reach all the non-respondents and those who had reported to be unemployed previously. Information on employment status was collected up to 31 December 2000 as required by the University Grant Committee (UGC). Data validation and analysis as well as compilation of statistical tables were done in late February and March 2001. A total of 52 graduates replied, representing a response rate of 90%.

# III. Summary of Results

# 3.1 *Employment Situation*

Among the 52 dental graduates who responded to the survey, 92% (or 48 graduates) were in employment as dental surgeons within six months of graduation. Another 7.7% (or 4 graduates) were still seeking employment at the time of the survey. (Table 1 on p.4)

#### 3.2 Employment Destinations of New Dental Graduates

All the 48 graduates who were in employment as dental surgeons provided information on their employer. 56% (or 27 graduates) of these graduates were employed by private clinics, 25% (or 12 graduates) by the Prince Philip Dental Hospital, 17% (or 8 graduates) by Community Clinics. One graduate was self-employed as sole proprietor in a private clinic.

#### 3.3 <u>Time Taken to Secure Employment</u>

The time taken to secure employment was shorter than the previous year. By November 2000, 98% of the 2000 graduates had secured full-time employment, compared with 78% in 1999. (Chart 1 on p.8)

#### 3.4 Job Lead Source

Job notices posted in the Faculty accounted for 37% of the job leads. Dental Association Newsletters, friends and relatives accounted for 16% and 28% respectively. (Table 3 on p.6)

# 3.5 <u>Workload</u>

The working hours of the new dental surgeons ranged from less than 30 hours to more than 70 hours per week. (Chart 2 on p.8)

Around 24% of the graduates of 2000 attended to more than 10 treatments per working day, compared with 35% in 1999. (Chart 3 on p.9)

#### 3.6 <u>Income</u>

The monthly income of the dental graduates of 2000 ranged from \$15,000 to \$30,000. The median monthly income was \$20,000, same as 1999. The average monthly income was \$22,752, representing an increase of 4% from the previous year's \$21,970. (Chart 4 on p.9)

# 3.7 Work Location and Area

52% of the dental graduates worked in the Hong Kong Island. (Table 4A on p.7). 75% of them worked in residential area. (Table 4B on p.7)

# 3.8 Job Satisfaction

75% of the dental graduates were very satisfied or quite satisfied with their jobs (83% in 1999). The most important factors of satisfaction were responsibility given, supervision given, and working condition. Dissatisfaction stemmed mainly from advancement/career prospects, terms of employment, and workload. (Charts 5 & 6 on p.10)

#### 3.9 *Future Plans*

Around 64% of the dental graduates planned to set up private practice in future (49% in 1999). 23% indicated a wish for hospital/clinic work, compared with the previous year's 43%. (Chart 7 on p.11)









#### AVERAGE DAILY CASELOAD OF NEW DENTAL SURGONS 1999 - 2000





These charts show the percentage of graduates in full-time employment.


# JOB SATISFACTION OF 2000 NEW DENTAL SURGEONS


