Some Personalities in Modern China

A course of 20 lectures designed to give an outline of the cultural, historical and political background of China between the latter part of the 19th century to the early part of the 20th century. The material will be presented in the form of anecdotes, excerpts of literary writings, biographical details and reminiscences. The personalities dealt with include Huang Tsun-hsien (黃遵憲), Sheng Hsüan-huai (盛宣懷), Chang Ch'ien (張謇), Chang Pin-ling (章炳麟), Wang Kuo-wei (王國維), Liang Shih-i (梁士詒), Tang Shao-i (唐紹儀), Ts'ai Yuan-pei (蔡元培), Chang Yuan-chi (張元濟), Yen Fu (嚴復), Huang Hsing (黃興), Ting Wen-chiang (丁文江), Ch'en Tu-hsiu (陳獨秀), Chiang Hang-hu (江亢虎), Li Ken-yuan (李根源), Chang Chi-luan (張季鸞).

The course will run from January to May 1961 and the tutor will be Mr. MA MENG, B.A. (YENCHING), Principal of the Language School, Institute of Oriental Studies.

East-West Cultural Contacts

A series of six lectures on the cultural contacts of two civilizations and their interpenetration in a Peking setting. The lectures will interpret this contact in terms of the symbolism of Chinese art and language.

The lectures will run from January through February 1961. The tutor of the course will be Mr. HENRI VETCH, Publisher of the University of Hong Kong Press, who resided in Peking from 1920 to 1954.

Wit and Humour in English

A course of 10 weekly lectures on Wit and Humour in English from Chaucer to the present day. Professor BLUNDEN will open the course with a lecture on the Wit and Humour of Chaucer and Skelton, which will be followed by such topics as Anonymous Drinking Songs, Comic Relief, Burlesque and Parody in Shakespeare, Dickens, W. S. Gilbert, Shaw, Wilde, and Modern Wits.

The course will run from January to April 1961. Tutors will include Professor EDMUND BLUNDEN, C.B.E., M.C. M.A. (OXON.), F.R.S.L.; Mr. ALAN GREEN, M.A. (OXON.); Mrs. MARY VISICK, M.A., B.LITT. (OXON.); Mr ALEC M. HARDIE, M.A. (OXON.); Dr. BARBARA ROOKE, M.A. (QUEEN'S), PH.D. (LOND.); Mrs. C. M. BLUNDEN, M.A., DIP.ED. (OXON.).

A course of 20 weekly meetings covering discussions on the Elements of Style, Syntax, The Tenses, Common Errors, Precis Writing, Choice of Words, Business Letters, Professional Examination Papers, and other topics. There will also be practical criticism of prose passages by various writers.

The course will run from October 1960 to March 1961. The tutor will be Mr. T. C. LAI, M.A., Acting Director of Extra-Mural Studies, University of Hong Kong.

A course of 48 lectures (2 per week for 24 weeks) in Colloquial Japanese. The course is designed to impart an ability to understand and speak modern colloquial Japanese, with the introduction of both Katakana and Hirakana and some simple Kanji (Chinese characters) in the later stages.

Text used: Japanese Reader by Mr. & Mrs. O. VACCARI (MARUZEN).

The course will run from September 1960 to April 1961. The tutor will be Mr. LOH TSE-YEE, B.A. (MEIJI UNIVERSITY), Lecturer in Chu Hai College and United College.

Second-Year Japanese

A second-year course of 48 lectures (twice weekly). Apart from being an advanced course in colloquial Japanese, more common literary and colloquial expressions, simple grammatical exercises and some Chinese characters will be included. The main text will be from Naganuma Nooe's *The Standard Japanese Reader Book I Part II* and students are advised to equip themselves with either an "English/Japanese and Japanese/English" or a "Chinese/Japanese and Japanese/Chinese" dictionary.

The course will run from September 1960 to April 1961. The tutor will be Mr. DONALD P. H. LIAO, B. ARCH. (HONS.) H.K., DIP. L.D. (DUNELM).

No textbook will be used but students are advised to purchase copies of *The Oxford Book of Portuguese Verse*.

A second-year course with 60 meetings in the academic year (2 per week for 3 terms of 10 weeks each) in Cantonese. The study of characters will include vocabulary, spoken and literary expressions and idioms, given in the form of simple prose passages. Etymology of characters and classical reference of idioms will be touched on as study progresses. Specially prepared and well graded texts will be supplied by the tutor.

The course will start from September 1960 and will continue until May 1961. The tutor will be Mr. PAUL FONG, B.A. DIP. ED. (H.K.)

The Interpretation of Survey Maps

This course is conceived in broad terms (and will be relatively non-technical) as an exploration of the problems in this field, which face architects in a modern urban society.

It will be run in 2 parts each consisting of 10 lectures (2 per evening twice a week for five weeks in all). Each part is designed to be complete in itself, but students should not attempt Part II unless they have either followed Part I or done similar work elsewhere.

EDUCATION

Child Psychology

A course of 12 weekly meetings, being a scientific study of the development of the child from infancy to pre-adolescence. The difficulties with which parents are commonly faced in bringing up their children will also be analysed.

Histogenesis

During the two previous years, courses have been given on the basic tissues of the body, and on the histology of the various organs. This course of 10 weekly lectures is intended to cover those changes in the structure of embryonic cells leading to the appearance of recognizable tissues.

Histogenetic changes are essentially a complex of decentralizing processes involving various trends and causing embryonic development to pass from a pre-functional to a functional state. The timing of this varies considerably in the various tissues and organs of the body.
