This biophysics course begins with a chemistry lecture which explains, in simple terms, what is meant by "large molecules" and poses the basic questions that occupy the rest of the course. The physical approaches to the elucidation of molecular structure are many and varied, including well known properties of solutions such as viscosity, and extending into new and refined techniques which are reaching towards pictures of single molecules. The course concludes with a simple description of the greatest triumph of this new science: the structure of deoxyribonucleic acid (DNA)—a giant molecule found in almost all living cells—and with this a theory of replication.



Applicants, provided they possess the Hong Kong English School Leaving Certificate, or the Chinese School Leaving Certificate with credit in English, & have attended all the three sections mentioned above, are eligible to sit for examination at the conclusion of the course. If successful, they will be awarded a certificate issued jointly by the Hong Kong Library Association & the Department of Extra-Mural Studies.
