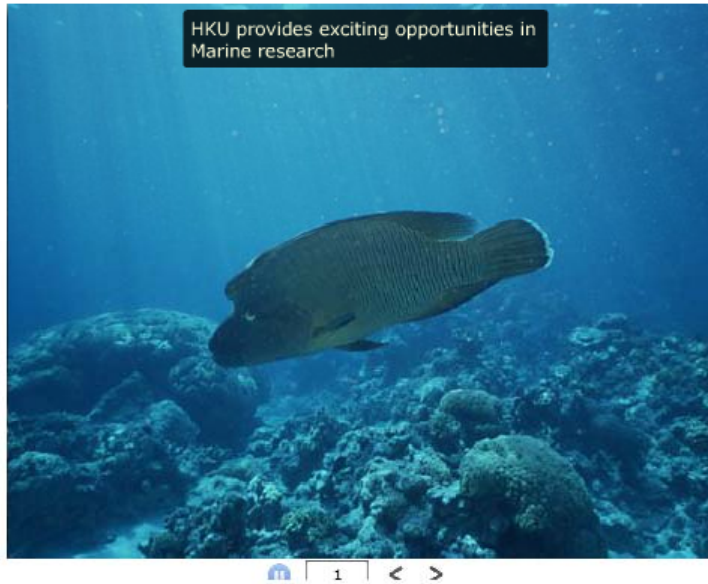

Abstract	At meiotic prophase, chromatin loops around a proteinaceous core, with the sizes of these loops varying between species. Comparison of the morphology of sequence-related inserts at different sites in transgenic mice demonstrates that loop size also varies with chromosomal geography. Similarly, chromatin loop lengths differ dramatically for interstitially and terminally located hamster telomeric sequences. Sequences, telomeric or otherwise, located at chromosome termini, closely associate with the meiotic proteinaceous core, forming shorter loops than identical interstitial sequences. Thus, we present evidence that different chromatin packaging mechanisms exist for interstitial versus terminal chromosomal regions, which act separately from those operating at the level of the DNA sequence. Chromosomal position plays the dominant role in chromatin packaging.

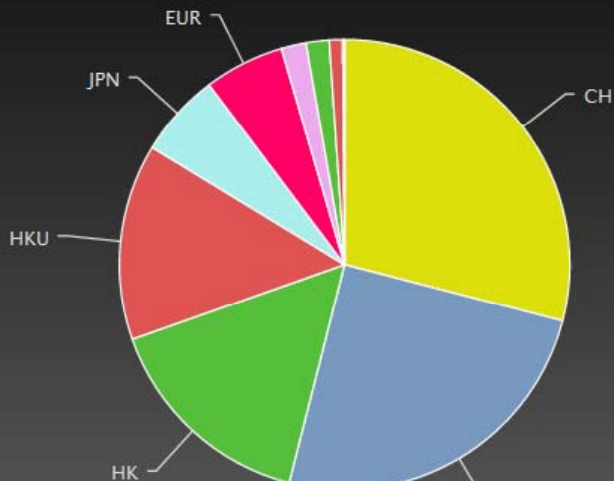

Springer Open Choice @ University of Hong Kong

Faculty and students affiliated with HKU are now encouraged to use the Open Choice option to publish their articles. The published articles can be accessed immediately by anyone anywhere.

About the agreement

In March of 2010, HKU Libraries and Springer reached an agreement which allows researchers at the affiliated institutions of HKU to publish their research in Springer journals using Springer Open Choice. Springer's Open Choice program offers full and immediate open access (free to the reader) for articles that are accepted for publication after a process of rigorous peer-review. Accepted HKU articles will appear as usual in Springer print journals, and will be published electronically using open access on SpringerLink and the HKU institutional repository, The HKU Scholars Hub. The pilot project will run from March 2010 to February 2012.

Open access made easy

You will be offered the open choice option once your article has been accepted for publication after peer review. The cost of having your article published with open access is covered by the agreement between HKU and Springer.

Abstract

Introduction

Both laparoscopic colectomy and application of enhanced recovery program (ERP) in open colectomy have been demonstrated to enable early recovery and to shorten hospital stay. This study evaluated the impact of ERP on results of laparoscopic colectomy and comparison was made with the outcomes of patients prior to the application of ERP.

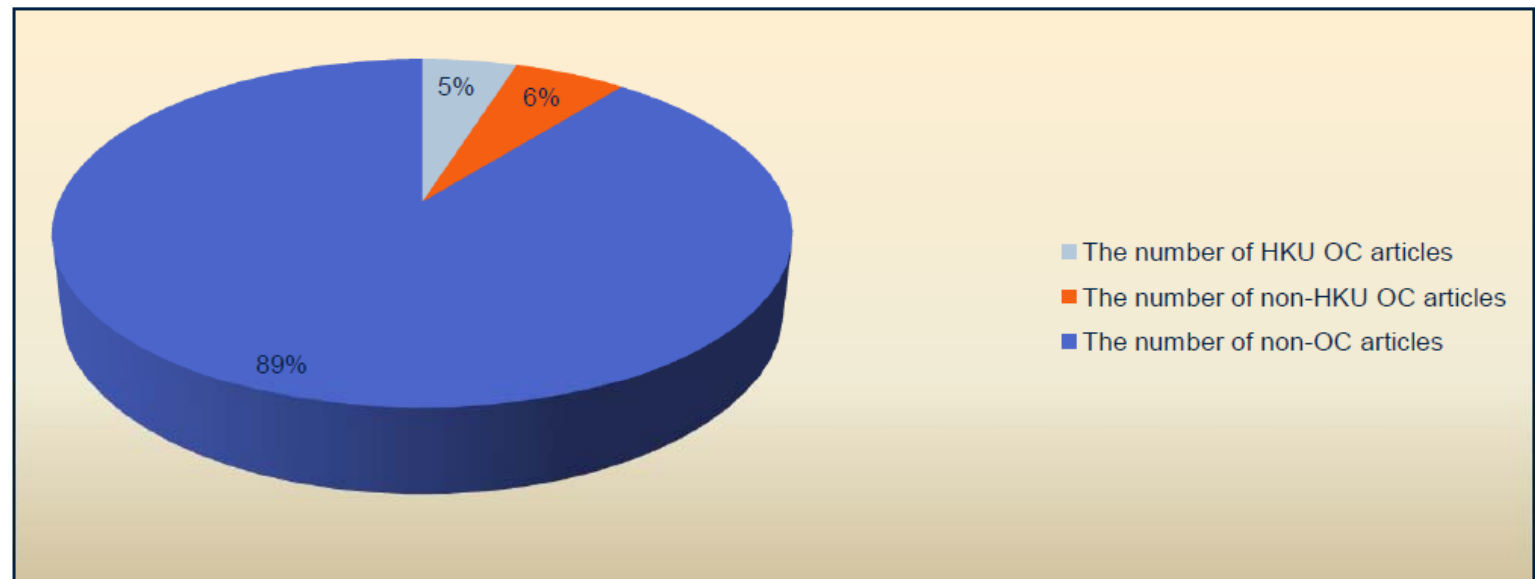
Methods

An ERP was implemented in the authors' center in December 2006. Short-term outcomes of consecutive 84 patients who underwent laparoscopic colonic cancer resection 23 months before (control group) and 96 patients who were operated within 13 months; after application of ERP (ERP group) were compared.

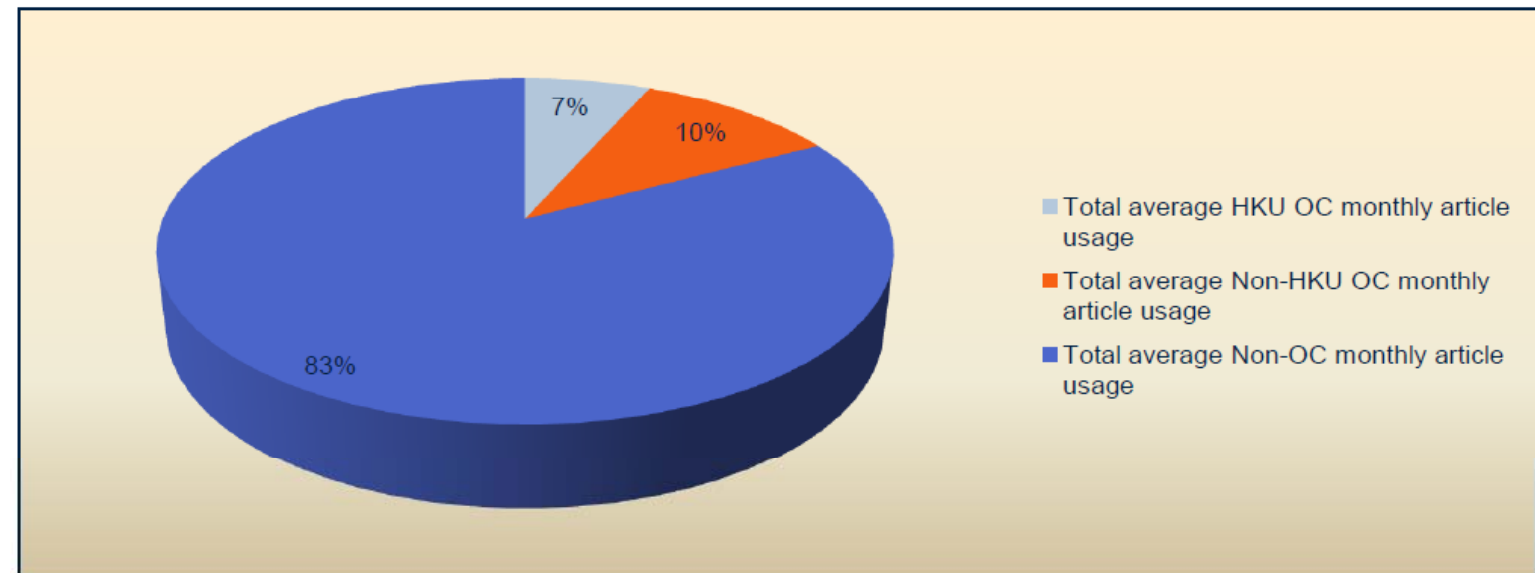

1) 2011 YTD total number of articles

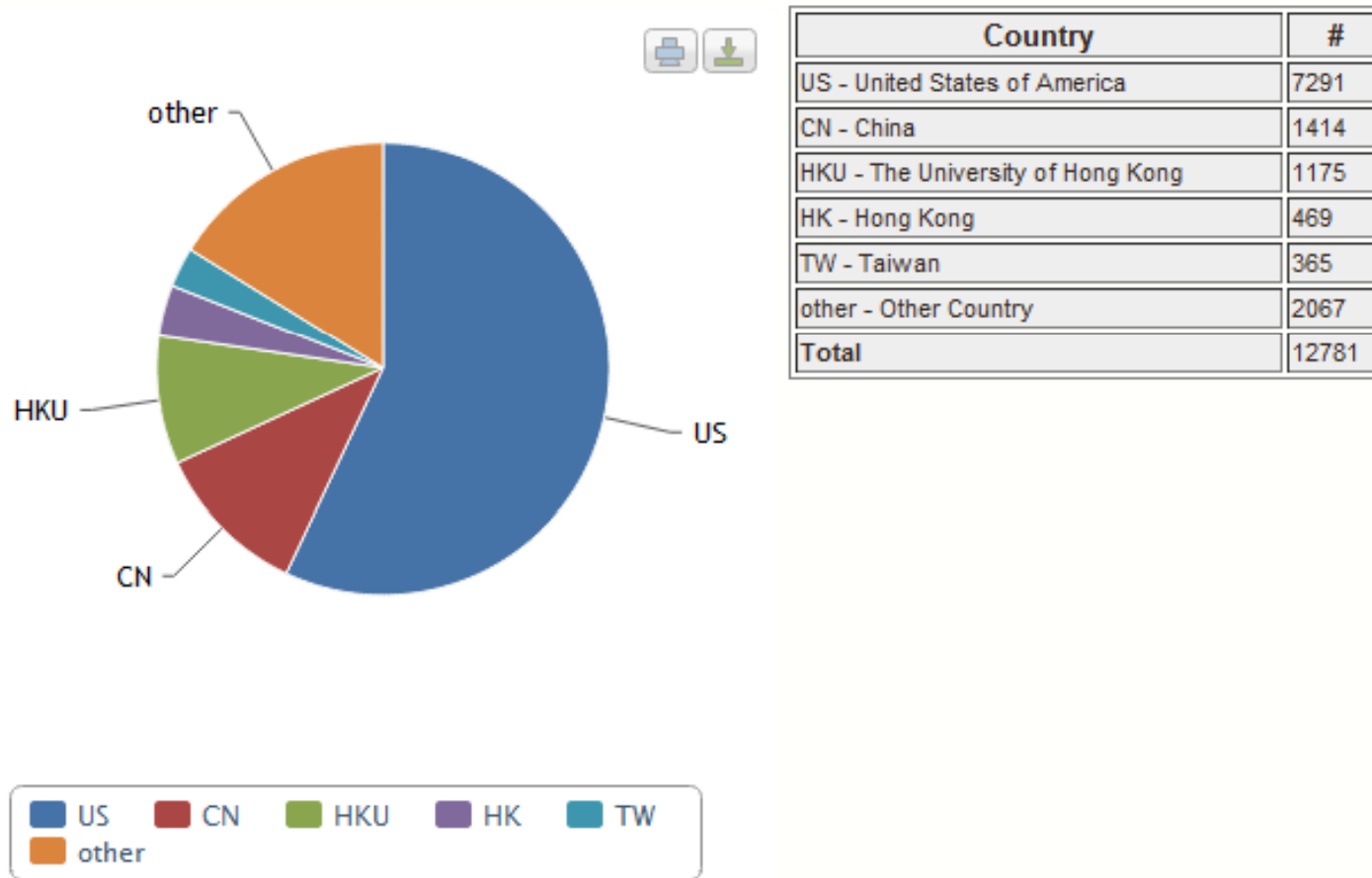


2) 2011 YTD total average monthly article usage
