
About HKU



- Evolved from the Hong Kong College of Medicine, founded in 1887
- Founded 1911, HK's first
- Multidisciplinary/comprehensive undergraduate & postgraduate
- 26,000 students (Government & self funded)
- 111,000 students (Continuing education school)



The Library was established in 1912





Main Library & 6 Branch Libraries

- Main Library (est. 1912) comprises a rich collection of materials in the arts, humanities, architecture, social sciences, science and technology; holds two rare book collections and a unique collection of Hong Kong materials
- Fung Ping Shan Library (est. 1932) houses a 1 million volume collection in oriental languages, mainly Chinese.
- Yu Chun Keung Medical Library (est. 1965 and formerly the Lee Hysan Medical Library) houses a collections for clinical medicine, biomedical sciences, public health, nursing, and Chinese medicine.
- Lui Che Woo Law Library (est. 1969) has strong collections of legal materials from Hong Kong, the UK, and major Commonwealth jurisdictions.
- Education Library (est. 1978) provides materials in support of teaching including school textbooks, teacher manuals, teaching aids, Hong Kong examination papers, and audiovisual materials.
- Dental Library (est. 1981) supports the fields of dentistry, biomedicine and speech and hearing sciences.
- Music Library (est. 1981) has a collection of books, scores, journals and AV item



The HKU Situation




Budget Shift towards Electronic: HKU







Use of Print Materials: HKU





Hong Kong Higher Education and its Libraries




















- 8 government funded institutes of higher learning (UGC)
- 3 ranked in the top 50 in the world HKU (28);
 HKUST (40); CUHK (46) (QS Rankings, 2014)
- 69,000 UGC funded students (2011/12) 14% nonlocal
- Four year curriculum commenced September 2012 double cohort 3 year and 4 year programs in parallel
- Total students now 86,000
- Desire for "deep collaboration" among the eight








Total Circulation Transactions: JULAC








Monograph Overlap

Joint Universities Research Archive (JURA)


... to provide Hong Kong's JULAC libraries with an efficient, sustainable and secure climatecontrolled storage and retrieval facility for research materials that promotes shared access to scholarly information and facilitates the effective use of space within existing library buildings.



Why JURA?

- Crowded library shelves
- Extra students 4 year curriculum
- Changing demands on library spaces
 - Flexible
 - Varied
 - Meeting evolving curricula
 - Integrating print/digital
- Growth in print decreased but still significant






Volumes Added: JULAC

JURA: The Model

- HKU led and managed project
- Joint ownership
- Shared costs: equitable distribution
- Single copy
- Closed access
- 5.27 million capacity => 8.43 m after expansion (if needed)
- 59,000 metal bins stored on 3 floors (each 13.85m high)
- Automated Storage and Retrieval System (ASRS)

Models examined


- Traditional shelving (Box shelving)
- Traditional shelving (Spine out shelving)
- Compact shelving
- Harvard / Stanford method in multi-story building
- Harvard / Stanford method in single story building
- Automatic storage and retrieval system in multistory building
- Automatic storage and retrieval system in single story building

Why ASRS?

- Highest setup cost
- Lowest operating cost
- Automatic tracking of items
- Speed encourages use
- Ease of item management
- Low human effort
- Minimal margins of error




A 12 Storey Building



- 4 stories high ultimately but initially only 3
- 1 JURA storey = 3 regular floors
- So ultimately like a 12 storey building



- Three requirements by UGC:
 - Detailed design
 - Incorporation
 - Land allocated

- Final hurdle:
 - Capital Works Resource Allocation Exercise
 (CWRAE) upgrade status to B+
 - Legco approval

DISTRIBUTED PRINT JOURNAL STORAGE PROJECT MEMBER INSTITUTION AGREEMENT

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1 This understanding is made as of the date of last signature by and among JULAC eight tertiary education institution libraries and the Joint University Librarians Advisory Committee (JULAC).
- 1.2 The Joint University Librarians Advisory Committee was established in 1967 by the Heads of Universities Committee (HUCOM). It is a forum to discuss, coordinate, and collaborate on library information resources and services among the libraries of the eight tertiary education institutions funded by the University Grants Committee (UGC) of the Hong Kong SAR Government.
- 1.3 Among other projects, JULAC has embarked upon a distributed print journal project (the "Project") pursuant to which it will arrange for its members to store and archive.

Memorandum covers:

- Storage Obligations of Member Institution
- Original Form
- Cost
- Environmental Conditions
- Repairs and Restorations
- Damage or Loss
- Replacement Copies
- Bibliographic Identifiers
- JURA
- Access and Use
- Ownership
- etc



Assigning responsibility

- Make the assembling of runs as easy and straightforward possible
 - Large runs that could be completed by another library
 - Partial runs, then fill in the gaps
- Keep unique titles
- Spread the wealth/responsibility around as much as possible
 - Choose smaller libraries with complete runs whenever possible
 - Alternate between libraries with largest holdings
