


Demographics in Asia (1990's)

% of total population




Percentage of Hong Kong Elderly Population (aged 65+ and 75+) 1971 - 2001




Life expectancy (at birth) in Asia (1990's)




Life expectancy (at age 65) in Asia (1990's)

Development of Geriatric Medicine in Hong Kong Pioneering Initiatives

- 1975 First consultant-led government Geriatric Unit
- 1979 Geriatric Medicine included in the undergraduate curriculum
- 1981 Clinical bedside teaching in Geriatrics
- 1981 Hong Kong Geriatrics Society founded
- 1985 First lecturer in Geriatric Medicine
- 1986 Hong Kong Association of Gerontology founded
- 1987 First issue of Hong Kong Journal of Gerontology
- 1990 First issue of Journal of Hong Kong Geriatrics
 Society
- 1994 First professor in Geriatric Medicine
- 1994 Hospital-based community geriatric assessment teams set up

Hong Kong Geriatrics Society

- Founded in 1981 as a professional association in the field of geriatric medical care
- Object: to promote the advancement, training and research in geriatrics
- Membership: initially 20, now 134 members (93 regular & 41 associate)
- Regular members: accredited geriatrics specialists or higher specialty trainees in Geriatric Medicine
- Continuing medical education activities: inter-hospital geriatric meetings, scientific weeks, symposia, research paper presentations
- Publications: Journal of the Hong Kong Geriatrics Society (an international peer-reviewed journal), newsletters

Geriatric Services

- Acute assessment and care
- Rehabilitation

- Special services/clinics:
 - stroke unit, orthogeriatrics, psychogeriatrics
 - memory clinic, fall clinic, continence clinic, syncope clinic

- Geriatric day hospital
- Community geriatric services

Hospital Admissions in Geriatric Unit of Princess Margaret Hospital 1975 - 1998 Admissions




Out-patient Attendance in Geriatric Unit of Princess Margaret Hospital 1975 - 1998

Expertise of Geriatricians

- Awareness of the different presentation, course and the management of illness in the biologically aged person
- The organisation of hospital-based services appropriate to such patients
- The co-ordination of health and social services

Post-graduate Training in Geriatric Medicine in Hong Kong

- Overseas
 - UK, USA, Australia, New Zealand
- Local
 - 3 years of basic physician training/ intermediate exam. (MRCP)
 - 3 years of higher specialist training/ exit exam.

Geriatric Medicine in Hong Kong: Current Status (6/1999)

Mid-1997 population (6.5 million)

- 65+: 0.67 million (10.4% of total)
- 75+: 0.25 million (3.8% of total)
- 58 specialists in Geriatric Medicine
- 47 trainees in Geriatric Medicine
- 20 consultants in Geriatric Medicine in public hospitals
- 2 full-time academic posts (1 professor, 1 associate professor) in Geriatric Medicine
- 11 acute & 10 extended care hospitals with geriatric services (out of 42 public hospitals)

- Financing health care


Continuum of Residential Care for Elderly People


Geriatricians in Asia (1990s)
